



- Paper Straws






What is sustainability?

The ability of your organisation to sustain itself.












Can you make an impact?

Taking Action

- There comes a point where you can't do anymore
- Some action is in your direct control
- Many actions will be in your concern and influence






Control

You may already things that are within your control


- Turning lights off & tracking energy usage
- Looking at changing suppliers to be more ethical or local
- Things you can do quickly
- Some of it might be lifestyle too





Influence

- As an organisation, this is your superpower
- Most of your emissions will be under influence.
- But so is your impact.
- This is where you become a climate leader




Concern

Things in Concern are outside of your control. Get rid of them!

TURN IT OFF

- Reduce climate change news
- Reduce talking about how bad it is
- Talk about what you have **done**, and are doing.
- Focus on what you can achieve influence and control.
- Things you can do later move out of the way.








Taking Action

- Focus on what you can control
- Make sure to influence others too
 - Many in similar situations
 - Change happens collectively through
 - **Conditional Cooperation**







Every decision is a climate decision

To drive real change, we need to

engage everyone.







- Climate can't be an afterthought or something to "get done".
- It's core to your daily decisions.
- Staff and the board need to be fully engaged to successfully adapt and thrive.



Where do you start?


- Set up a Green Team
- Put it on the board's agenda
- Draft an environmental or sustainability policy





Set up a Green Team

- Collaborative team to discuss and raise opportunities
- Find solutions and challenge decisions internally
- Keep engagement going





Engage the Board & Put on the agenda

- Senior leadership are key to successful transformation
- Raise the topic at board meetings
- Utilise your savings and investments
- What's your exposure to climate risk?



Oraft an environmental or sustainability policy

- Tell your story!
- Be ready for legislation and conditionality
- Make it public and easy to find
- Bring green team and board together to share what they have
 - Done
 - Are working on doing


